Astronomy is that sublime science that inspires the contemplative mind to soar aloft and read in the heavens with wisdom strength and beauty of great creator.

March is significant to astronomy. March marks the "First Point of Aires". It is the time when the star Aries in the celestial sphere coincides with the prime meridian on earth. Astronomers used this to mark the location of all other stars. The coordinates of which were measured by Declination or angle above the celestial horizon (similar to latitude on earth) and Sidereal Hour Angle the degrees away from Aires. Celestial navigation, which was used of thousands of years before the advent of electronic systems such as GPS, was base on taking a sight of the stars (Measuring the observed attitude with sextant and marking the time) and calculating with the starts position in the celestial sphere.

It is also the time of the vernal equinox when the sun at its zenith is over the equator and the earth's axis is neither tilted toward or away from the sun. On this date all points of the earth experience equal durations of daytime and night.

Consider that astronomy has numerous facets to contemplate. The mystical and religious aspects of creation, the scientific understanding of celestial bodies and our applications, the implications of climate and return seasons, the variety of scenes each season displays to the discerning eye, and they philosophical aspects of equality.
