Greetings Brethren,

As a sailor I have always been drawn to the images of the Anchor and the Ark, "...emblems of a well-grounded hope and a well-spent life."

Very appropriate symbols for our current time of national trial. They are very overt emblems of the divine guidance that "safely wafts us over this tempestuous sea of troubles and that anchor which shall safely moor us in a peaceful harbor..." (An Encyclopedia of Freemasonry, Albert G. Mackey 1906).

While the two symbols are usually tied (sorry, unavoidable pun) to each other, Mackey points out that they actually come from two very separate periods of history. Noah's Ark of course dates back to the Old Testament but the anchor as symbol of hope was not used

till the time of St. Paul. Never the less, the two symbols are much more powerful together than separate. As the sea of this life carries us through fair seas and foul, to destinations we know not yet, there is always the hope of an anchor to keep us off rocky lee shores and safe in calm safe harbors.

As I write this we know not where the current health challenge will send the Ark of our country or even as individuals. No one can yet know the virulence or the therapy of the poorly understood virus. Let us hope that many claims are being overblown for various reasons as in the past and time will give us 20/20 vision to understand this pandemic and best manage its containment with evidence based science.

Now is also a get time to get involved in committee work. There is great need in community service, charity, scholarship, lodge activities and other committees you can help with.

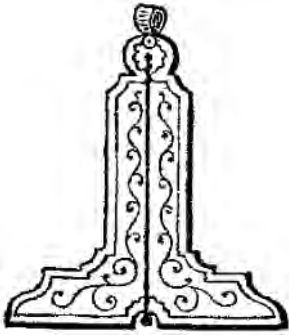
As always communication is important. If not already please make sure you are getting both our app notifications and emails. Also please check in with our older (not me!) members periodically to see if they need anything.

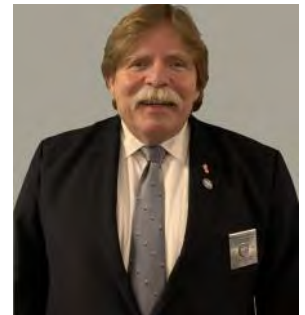

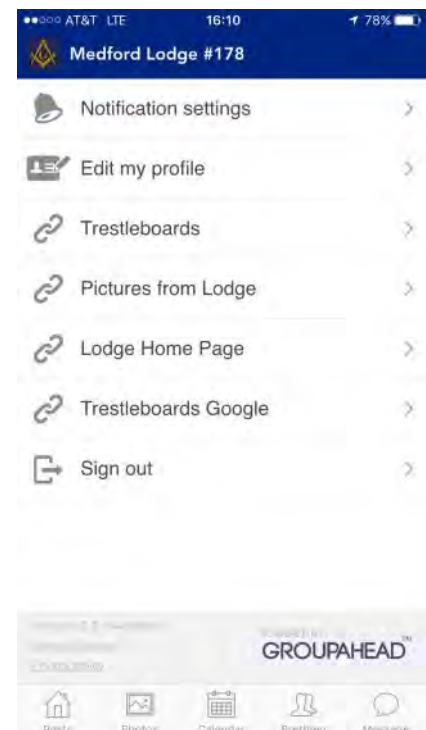
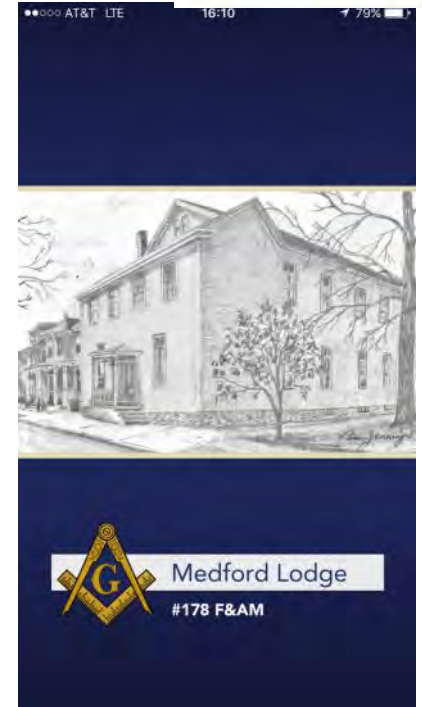

My Brothers All,

Unfortunately, I was hopeful that my next communication to you would have been more uplifting and positive, but due to ongoing increased developments with the Coronavirus (COVID-19) and the escalation of government directives and executive orders, imposed quarantines, limitation of assembly, and the overall concern for all our health and welfare, the following actions will be taken as follows:

The directive issued on March 13th, 2020, that all Grand Lodge, Blue Lodge and Appendant Bodies meetings, activities and events, be hereby canceled until March 31st, 2020, will hereby be extended until April 30th, 2020. Exceptions will be Masonic funerals and Blood Drives conducted under the supervision, direction and adherence of practices of the American Red Cross. Worshipful Masters and Officers may continue to pay bills, handle normal correspondences and building maintenance, as needed.

Our Annual Communication at Bally's Atlantic City Hotel and Casino, scheduled for April 22nd and 23rd, has been canceled. Official Receptions for the month of April have been postponed. The three Candidates nights scheduled for April will be held if possible, prior to the rescheduled Annual Communication. Dates are to be determined. In agreement with the Elected Line, the intent is to schedule and hold our Annual Communication, Election of Grand Lodge Officers, and Installation, as soon as possible when the current crisis subsides and allows.

Voting for Grand Lodge contested Offices, and the Grand Lodge Budget will be available to all Grand Lodge voting members, Past Masters, Worshipful Masters and Wardens, online. Voting will coincide with the Annual Communication, when determined. Registration for online voting will be extended. A directive will be forthcoming from the Grand Lodge Office about online voting in anticipation of your questions and concerns. Videos will be made and posted of the Candidates' statements to the Grand Lodge website. The New Jersey Freemason magazine, containing the bios and statements of the Candidates, has gone to press and will be in the mail ASAP.

I have requested the Information Services and Technology Committee to provide information pertaining to various interacting media venues available to assist the Worshipful Masters and Lodges to communicate with each other. The Grand Educator will be providing more educational information and services to the Grand Lodge website for your further enlightenment. Let us continue to do what we do best, help and support each other. Your Grand Lodge Office will remain open and has been working very hard for you; and is there for any and all of your needs.


