Committees:

Brethren, running a lodge is a complex operation. Its responsibilities cannot be accomplished by the Master and Wardens alone. I am establishing the following committees and am asking for volunteers to either chair or be on one or more of the following committees:

Relief Committee – By our Bylaws a committee to officiate as almoners to aid the distressed

Audit – By our Bylaws a committee of 3 not holding other office whose duty is to examine the books and accounts of the Treasurer, Secretary and Trustees, and report on writing upon the correctness of the same at the next regular communications after report of said officers and Trustees have been received and other such times as the Worshipful Master may direct

Charity Committee – Committee to plan, organize and run lodge fund raising events for the benefit of Masonic or other charities (Not for the benefit of Medford Lodge) and propose to the lodge beneficiaries

Sickness and Distress Committee – Point of contact for lodge members to report to the lodge on the illness, hospitalization or cases of severe hardship to the lodge. Also to contact and on occasion to visit hospitalized, infirmed or bedridden brothers and provide updates to the lodge

Scholarship and Education Committee – Committee to be the point of contact and seek nominations for lodge and grand lodge educator of the year and scholarship nominations from the local school district for worthy graduating seniors

By- Laws Committee – Committee of 3 to review and propose amendments to the Lodge By Laws (Last updated 2008)

Refreshment committee – Plan and coordinate meals and refreshments of the lodge assisting the Stewards

Ritual Committee – Past Masters to instruct the Officers in the correct interpretation and performance of ritual. Coaches during degree rehearsals and maintains proficiency through participation at DLI
