Message from the East





Greetings Brethren,

We hopefully will be able to enjoy the Master Mason degree in the near future. Therefore I thought it would be appropriate to consider this month the working tool of the Master Mason, the trowel.

Albert Mackey writes that by it we "are taught to spread the cement of affection and kindness, which unites all members of the Masonic family".

The Entered Apprentice needs only the 24 inch gauge and gavel to shape individual stones. The Fellow Craft Mason needs the plumb, level and square to position the stones according to the plans laid down upon the Trestleboard.

But it is the responsibility of the Master Mason, after assuring that the prior required steps were performed properly, to use his

working tool, the trowel, to cement the parts of the whole as a unified structure. Thus the temple is able to weather and withstand the challenges and test of time.

What is the cement of our symbolic temple made of? Surely, as Mackey alludes, it must be love, support and social interactions that cement the Brothers together into one unified and beautiful temple.

Forces outside our Lodge have recently weathered that cement. Just as all longstanding buildings may occasionally need "repointing" to maintain the cement that holds it together, I wonder if the recent external forces have not worn away layers of the cement keeping our temple strong. So my Brothers all, now is the time to dust off our trowels, and "repoint" and renew the cement which bonds our temple together. As meetings and activities have recently been forbidden, now it is even more important that we all individually work to keep the temple strong. Do not let apathy take control, but rather actively work to participate in keeping our Lodge strong. Make the effort to stay in communication with your Brothers, use the Lodge app to stay in touch, make the effort to meet with one another, lastly, step up your game and volunteer for Lodge committees and officer positions (see this months Notes). Rather than be merely another "ring and a pin, I'm in" Mason on the sidelines. Your involvement will bring untold rewards through your involvement with your Brothers. Thus our Lodge will stay strong through these challenges.

Notes from the SW



Brothers,

As we embrace the New Year with its potential for growth and prosperity, please keep in mind that we are still in the midst of a pandemic that requires physical and mental endurance. Military psychology teaches us that overcoming obstacles and achieving success involves: Patience in building mental endurance, Visualization of successful outcomes, and Effective relaxation throughout the ordeal.

Brother Benjamin Franklin (1706 – 1790) was a man of science and diplomacy with abundant wisdom, creativity, patience, responsibility, and accountability. He remains an invaluable resource throughout our lives.

Benjamin Franklin was born on January 17, 1706 in Boston, Massachusetts. He was initiated in 1731 at St. John' Lodge in Philadelphia, PA. On June 24, 1732 he was appointed Junior Warden of the Grand Lodge of Pennsylvania and then Grand Master in 1735.

Brother Franklin published the Constitutions of the Freemasons, which is the first Masonic book printed in America. He is said to have laid the cornerstone of Independence Hall with other brethren of St. John's Lodge.

The brief history that follows is taken from my 1895 edition of the Autobiography of Benjamin Franklin. In approximately 1754, during the French and Indian War, Brother Franklin met with General Edward Braddock (1695 – 1755) in Fredericktown, Maryland. At that time, Gen. Braddock was "waiting impatiently for the return of those he had sent through the back parts of Maryland and Virginia to collect wagons." When Brother Franklin was about to depart, approximately 25 wagons arrived and seeing such a small amount of wagons, Gen. Braddock "declared the expedition was then at an end, being impossible, and exclaimed against the ministers for ignorantly sending them into a country destitute of the means of conveying their stores, luggage, etc., not less than 150 wagons being necessary."

Brother Franklin then "happened to say, I thought it was a pity that they had not been landed in Pennsylvania, as in that country almost every farmer had his wagon." Gen. Braddock took notice and said, "Then you, sir, who are a man of interest there, can probably procure them for us, and I beg you will undertake it."

The advertisement commissioned by Brother Franklin read, "Lancaster, April 26, 1755. Whereas, one hundred and fifty wagons with four horses to each wagon, and fifteen hundred saddle or pack horses, are wanted for the service of his Majesty's forces, now about to rendezvous at Wills Creek; and his Excellency Gen. Braddock having been pleased to empower me to contract for the hire of the same; I hereby give notice, that I shall attend for that purpose, at Lancaster, from this day to next Wednesday evening; and at York from next Thursday morning till Friday evening; where I shall be ready to agree for wagons and teams, or single horses, on the following terms."

Brother Franklin was successful in this mission and writes, "The general, too, was highly satisfied with my conduct in procuring him the wagons, and readily paid my account of disbursements; thanking me repeatedly, and requesting my

further assistance in sending provisions after him." Gen. Braddock, unfortunately was later defeated, but managed to pay for the further assistance Brother Franklin provided prior to the general's death.

Brother Franklin describes Gen. Braddock as "a brave man, and might probably have made a figure as a good officer in some European war" but "he had too much self-confidence, too high an opinion of the validity of regular troops, and too mean a one of both Americans and Indians." Brother Franklin believes that if Gen. Braddock "had treated them kindly; but he slighted and neglected them, and they gradually left him."


