Message from the East





Listen my children and you shall hear, of the midnight ride of Paul Revere." Thus starts the famous poem written for the entertainment of his grandchildren by Henry Wadsworth Longfellow in 1860, more than 100 years after the actual event. The poem c Continues with "Ready to ride and spread the alarm / Through every Middlesex village And farm / for the country folk to be up and to arm." Although the poem made Brother Paul Revere famous, it has little connection with reality (fake poems?) and has been re- Peated in far too many school history books. Given that this April 18th makes it 251 years Since that event with a very heavy Masonic involvement, I thought it would be interesting to look at the real story.

For starters, Brother Revere was only one of as many as ten different riders that night. We know some of the others included William Dawes, Dr. Samuel Prescott and Went- Worth Cheswell, a free African who held several elected positions including constable and justice of the peace, who was to ride to Portsmouth.

Brother Paul Revere was 25 years old that night, the second man in North America tobecome knighted in the Masonic Order of Knights Templar. He would later become a Lodge Secretary. Although remembered for being a silversmith, he was also a dentist (significant rtoon engraver, revolutionist gun powder maker and later built his own foundry. Despite that they with being a part of the Boston Tea Party along with numerous other Masons, including Brothers

Samuel Adams, John Hancock, Joseph Warren and others. In fact, there were so many Brothers raiding the ship that night that the regular communication meeting scheduled the same evening was adjourned on account of the few members in attendance.

With the local economy not doing very well the young silversmith-dentist supplemented his income carrying messages from Boston to New York, which afforded him free passage through British troops. That Spring General Gage had the British fleet in Boston harbor and was looking to take Brother John Hancock and Brother Samuel Adams prisoners and then seize rebel arms stored at Concord. To escape being taken prisoners Adams and Hancock hid away in a parsonage to the west in Lexington. The plan for their safety was directed by Brother Dr. Joseph Warren, who assigned the various riders their routes and objectives. Warren later became General Warren and was felled at the battle of Lexington. In Hiram Abiff fashion, he was buried anonymously in a shallow grave, marked by a green sapling. When Paul Revere and other Brothers went to locate his remains they found a mass grave of several other patriots, he was identified by the metal "jewels" of platesand wires that his friend and dentist Paul Revere had installed as his false teeth a few years ago. The bady was raised and returned to Boston for a "proper burial" in Masonic tradition.

Paul Revere did devise the plan to use one light if by land, two if by sea, but he never saw the lights when they were displayed. Warren already had Revere being rowed undetected through the British fleet to a waiting horse on the other side of the Charles river. To ensure backup, William Dawson was given a longer and different route to Lexington. They never used the phrase "the British are coming!" for the countryside had both loyalist and revolutionist households. Both men had but one task, to alert John Hancock and Samuel Adams to flee before the British arrived. That task accomplished, they restedbefore running into Samuel Prescott coming home from his girlfriend's house at 1 am. The three decided to spread the word on the way to Concord, but were soon intercepted by British soldiers, thereby ending any chance for them to alert the

"Country folk to be up and to arm". As for Mr. Longfellow's poem, in 1896 poet Helen Moore published a rebuttal: "Tisall well for the children to / of the midnight ride of Paul Revere / but why should my name be quite forgot, / who rode as boldly and well God wot? / Why should I ask? The reason is clear / My name was Dawes and his Revere". Too bad she didnot add one more line; "For Revere was a Mason and Dawes was not".

And now you know the rest of the story, and the significant Masonic patriotic involvement.



EDICT

WHEREAS, the current worldwide COVID-19 pandemic, which has necessitated the prior Edicts, continues; and

WHEREAS, the State of New Jersey has continued to operate under the Executive Orders of the Governor; and

WHEREAS, the United States is still in the process of re-opening America under Guidelines issued by the White House and the Center for Disease Control; and

WHEREAS, the suspension of the operation of any section of the Constitution, By-Laws, rules and regulations of the Grand Lodge, which is not a Landmark, as is necessary to accomplish the purposes of protection of our members during the ongoing pandemic, remains in effect, as previously ordered.

NOW THEREFORE, it is on this 11th day of March 2021, EDICTED and ORDERED as follows:

- 1. All prior Edicts relating to the COVID-19 pandemic, which are not modified or superseded by this Edict are incorporated herein and shall remain in full force and effect.
- 2. Attendance at any indoor Lodge meeting, or function, shall be limited to the numbers as prescribed by the current limits placed in force by the most recent Executive Order from the Governor of New Jersey, and shall be permitted to increase as the numbers permitted in the Executive Orders increase. As of March 19, 2021, that number is 25 persons per room, regardless of the maximum capacity of the room. The same limits shall hold true for any outdoor gatherings, as governed by the ten current Executive Order. The serving of food before or after Lodge meetings or functions is now permitted.
- 3. Visitation by a Brother to a Lodge, other than one in which he is a member, is no longer discouraged, unless that attendance would cause the number of Masons present to exceed the number permitted

under the then current Executive Order, and potentially exclude regular members of that Lodge. In that

case, the visiting Brother is encouraged to yield to the attendance of the members of said Lodge.

4. Lodges may resume balloting upon petitions for Membership, affiliation, and all restorations, effective

March 19, 2021.

5. The conferral of the Masonic Degrees of Entered Apprentice and Fellowcraft may resume, effective March

19, 2021. Master Mason Degrees shall remain suspended until further notice.

6. Lodges are encouraged to continue the utilization of the ZOOM component of Lodge Meetings, in

accordance with the previously issued guidelines for Blue Lodge ZOOM Meetings, with the provision that

balloting shall now be permitted, including ballots that require secret balloting, and that ZOOM

participants shall be permitted to ballot, using the Polling feature of the ZOOM platform.

7. All Lodges shall continue to comply with the requirements of the Executive Orders of the Governor and

the requirements of the CDC. This Edict shall take effect immediately and shall remain in full force and

effect until revoked or modified by a subsequent Edict.
