# **Message from the East**





Greetings Brethren, The First Woman Freemason

At this year's Grand Lodge Annual Communication in Atlantic City, NJ, I had the good fortune of meeting and speaking with author, Kathleen Aldworth Foster. She spent a number of years researching the life of Elizabeth St. Leger Aldworth, who she initially thought was an ancestor. Elizabeth Aldworth lived in the 18<sup>th</sup> Century and was the daughter of Arthur St. Leger, the First Viscount Doneraile of Doneraile, County Cork, Ireland. Arthur St. Leger was a Freemason in Ireland.

Kathleen conducted extensive research on Elizabeth St. Leger Aldworth piecing together whatever historical data she could find. In the end, however, after exhausting all the information she could discover, Kathleen decided to write a historical fiction, which has been defined as "taking the factual record as far as it is known, using that as scaffolding, and then letting imagination build the structure that fills in those things

that we can never find out for sure."

The common belief is that a masonic meeting was taking place at a lodge room at Elizabeth's family home. Elizabeth had fallen asleep nearby and when awakened, she eavesdropped on the secret meeting. When she was discovered, a discussion ensued as to what was to become of her and apparently death was considered an option. Fortunately, for Elizabeth, a decision was made to make her a Freemason, who would then be bound to keep the secrets of the craft.

According to the author, "Today, there are thousands of active female Freemasons in offshoot organizations around the world. One of them, Le Droit Humain, named its first lodge after her." The Droit Humain is a "mixed-sex lodge" and has approximately 32,000 members in more than 60 countries around the world. It was cofounded by a Freemason raised at the Grand Lodge of France named Georges Martin. Could the apparent popularity of "mixed-sex" lodges warrant consideration by Grand Lodges in the United States in order to offset declining membership rolls?



Within six months my best friend's father was transferred to another state and my best friend moved out of Maryland. I was devastated, but instead of guitting the fire department I decided to stay and find my path. I enjoyed firefighting and the close bonding with the other fire department members. A brotherhood which I find is remarkably like masonry. I was trained as a firefighter and later emergency medical technician within Prince Georges County Maryland when I decided to enroll in my local community college in fire science, then transferred to the University of Maryland, College Park, MD into a double major: Fire Science and Urban Studies. In 1980 I graduated with a four-year degree then was immediately hired by the International Association of Fire Chiefs (IAFC) in Washington DC. I worked directly with the General Manager and Director of Operations to assist with their International Conference, grant writing, and to track federal legislative bills which were going before various congressional technical committees which could impacted the fire service. After four years with the IAFC I applied to a job announcement with the newly created New Jersey Bureau of Fire Safety. I accepted a job offer and started my new position in February 1985. My initial job duties were to implement the NJ fire code statewide and enhance code enforcement systems managed through the NJ Department of Community Affairs. I am convinced that through this effort which included the dedication of many incredible individuals throughout my time with the now Division of Fire Safety, lives and property have been saved. One center theme to me is that I like to help people, enriching their lives and helping them in times of personal hardship. Extending my hand to help them up from their life challenges.

#### What keeps you engaged and active with the lodge?

The close bonding and brotherhood were evident from the moment I walked into the door of the Lodge. The friendliness of the masons was warm and compassionate. A true natural presence which fostered well-being and mentored me to strive in the light to be a better man ... a better mason. Through the first three levels of masonry, I was struck by the symbolism and relativity to current life and world challenges. This connectivity to the past, present, and future life meaning is what interests me in masonry fostered through the Medford Lodge and its distinguished brethren.
