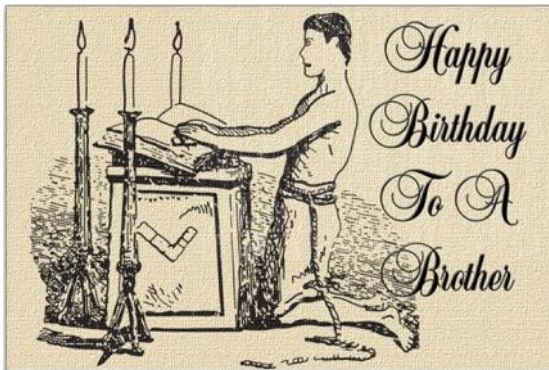

Did you know...



Born in 1911, Leonard Franklin Slye, was a singer and actor. Prior to his first movie role he auditioned for the Midnight Frolic radio show. This was at the encouragement of his sister Mary. He was shy and was not comfortable with the idea. The day after the audition he was asked to join The Rocky Mountaineers a local country music group. He would be in several bands until the Sons of the Pioneers in 1934. The Sons of the Pioneers would continue to perform replacing members when they retired or passed away. He would appear with them or they would be his backup group until his passing in 1998.

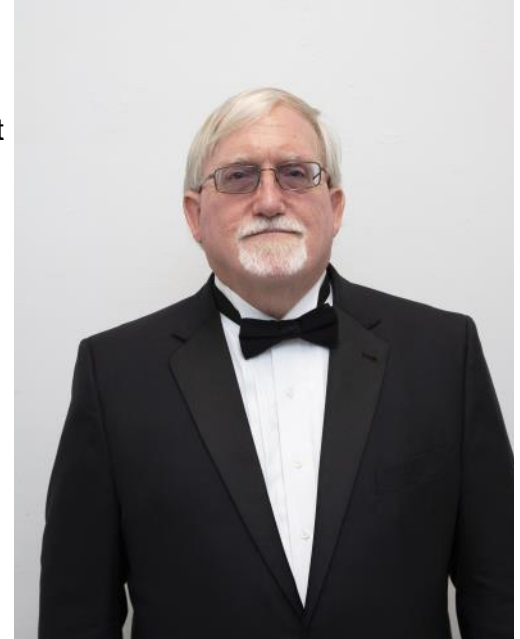
In 1932 he acquired a palomino colt called "Golden Cloud" which he renamed. Shortly after acquiring the palomino, he went on tour and met his first wife, Grace Arline. The couple would have three children together. Unfortunately Grace would pass away due to complications from child birth in 1946.

In 1940 he signed a new contract with the studio he worked with, Republic Pictures. In the clause he would have the right to his name, likeness and voice for merchandising. He would be second only to Walt Disney in regard to the amount of merchandise that bore his name and likeness.

He would meet his second wife, Dale Evans, while making a movie in 1944. Shortly after Grace Arline's passing Evans and Leonard would fall in love and be married just a year later. Leonard, Evans and the palomino appeared together regularly in Movies and Public appearances.

Brother Leonard Franklin Slye "Roy Rogers" was raised to Master Mason in 1946 at Hollywood Lodge No. 355.

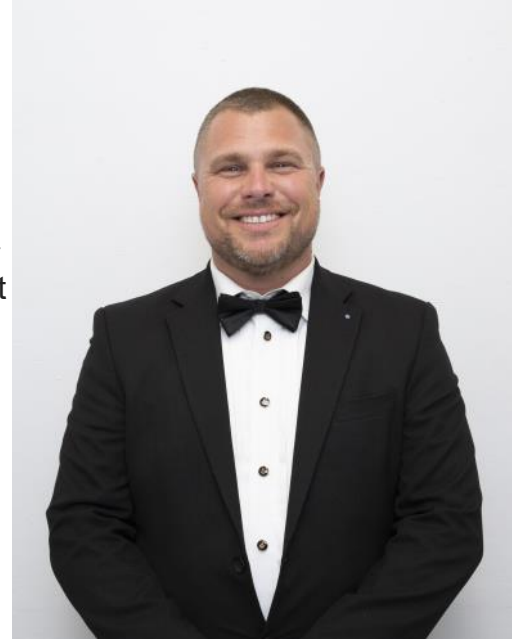

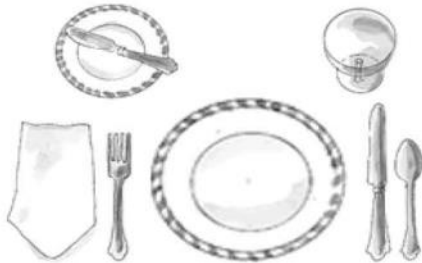
