Notes from the Senior Warden:


Did you know...



Born in what would become Oklahoma he was a cowboy, columnist, radio personality and actor. His entertainment career began in Wild West circuses where he was a trick roper able to throw three lassos at once. He then moved to Vaudeville continuing his rope tricks and

adding humor and wit to his show. He soon was discovered by Florenz Ziegfeld and the Ziegfeld Follies 1916 - 1925.

In 1925 the National Press Club dubbed him an Ambassador at Large of the United States and was among the first entertainers to travel by air around the country. His witticisms and stories began being printed in papers and he became a popular convention speaker and lecturer. After the Great Depression he moved to radio addressing more about the economy, unemployment and government yet maintaining the humorous banter. He became known as the conscience of the nation.



While working in Radio he began writing a column and started acting. He acted in silent and sound pictures and was known to ad lib his parts rather than follow the script. He was in high demand and would only do "clean" movies. His column continued to grow and was telegrammed to subscriber papers and appeared on the front pages. His frequently expressed his disappointment with big government and its failure to serve the American people. His remarks were not always appreciated.

His column was the most read around the world, he was a top box office draw and his radio show was number one in the country. A sampling of his legendary wit, "Never let yesterday use up too much of to-day".

Brother Will Rogers was raised to Master Mason in 1906 at Claremore Lodge No. 53, Claremore, Oklahoma.


