

Throughout our Ritual and Communications we are reminded of the Three Distinct Knocks. For most the Three Distinct Knocks are simply a request to enter the Lodge. There is much more to consider as Master Masons.

As we gain light in Masonry we expand our understanding of the Three Distinct Knocks beyond "Ask; and it shall be given; seek, and ye shall find; knock, and it shall be opened." When the door is opened a candidate gains admission into a fraternity whose

tenets are Brotherly Love, Relief and Truth. This symbolism continues as there are three symbolic degrees, three principal officers, three greater and three lesser lights and many more series of three to consider.

The Three Distinct Knocks have practical meaning for a candidate by alarming the Lodge and notifying the Master that the candidate is duly and truly prepared. As our knowledge grows we are reminded that the desire of the rights, lights and benefits of the Lodge represents the foundation on which we may continuously grow in Masonry.



Notes From The Worshipful Master



Notes from the Senior Warden:

Did you know...



Born in 1734 in Boston he was 13 when he left school to apprentice for his father as a silversmith. When his father passed away in 1754 he was too young to be the master of the shop. He then enlisted in the provincial Army to serve in the French Indian War where he served for

one year and returned to Boston. At this time the Boston economy was not good and was made worse by the British Stamp Act. This caused him to take up dentistry as silver items were a luxury.

In 1765 the Sons of Liberty formed and coincidently met at the Green Dragon, which was the same meeting place as St. Andrews Lodge. Frustration over policies coming from England and King George III had him making a variety of engravings about the events that were occurring in Massachusetts at the time including the Boston Massacre and a bowl commemorating the Massachusetts assembly's refusal to retract the Massachusetts Circular Letter which called for no taxation without representation.



In 1773 he, along with several of Sons of Liberty companions, boarded the merchant ship Dartmouth, dumping the tea in it's hold into Boston Harbor. The event now known as the Boston Tea Party was further protest to the Acts of King George III and England.

The next year he rode to New Hampshire on rumors that the British would be landing troops there. The Portsmouth Alarm as it is now called turned out to be a false alarm; however, it did inspire a rebel assault on Fort William and Mary where gun powder supplies were seized from the British soldiers that guarded the fort.

In 1775 his most famous ride took place. Riding from Charlestown to Lexington he avoided British patrols until being stopped just short of Lexington by a British roadblock. Held captive with other patriots he used every opportunity to warn the British soldiers not to continue on to Lexington. Eventually he and the other captives were able to scare off the soldiers. He was able to help John Hancock, one of the leaders of the revolution, and his family, escape from Lexington.

Brother Paul Revere was raised to Master Mason in 1761 at St. Andrews Lodge in Boston and was the Grand Master of Masons in Massachusetts from 1794 to 1797.

Notes from the Junior Warden.



The Plumb is the proper masonic emblem for the office of the Junior Warden and one of the three immovable jewels of the lodge, always to be found in the south. In reviewing ritual over the few weeks, I noticed it is mentioned in several places, showing

the importance of this symbol. It is mentioned in the Entered Apprentice Lecture as an immovable jewel, in the working tools of a fellowcraft mason, it can be seen in the MM degree as the jewel found on the body of our operative grand master, and in the Chaplin's speech during the candidate's perambulation for the fellowcraft degree.

"And the lord said unto me, Amos, what seeth thou, and I said, A plumbline. Then said the Lord, behold, I will set a plumb line in the midst my people Israel; I will not again pass by them anymore." Amos 7:8



I have heard the Chaplin speak these words countless times before and did not understand the meaning of the last sentence. After searching multiple biblical websites for meaning, Biblehub.com gave clarification of what was meant. The explanation given was the Lord will not overlook their transgressions, by not correcting and punishing them; or will not pardon them but inflict punishment for their sins.

This newfound information led me to the most important part of our ritual in my opinion because it leaves ever Mason with a lasting impression of the evening we enjoyed together. The closing charge by the master. "How should masons act brother Junior Warden? By the plumb Worshipful Sir". So, in closing brethren, I would like to implore you to uphold our practices and morals as Masons to all uninformed brethren. Remind them of their duties as a mason with gentle council and sound advice.


