## **Notes From The Senior Warden**



Notes from the Genior Warden:



Did you know ...

He was born near Kingston, Texas in 1925. The boy was small for his age, one of twelve children in a very poor family. He helped feed the family by hunting. He was a very good shot with a very unlikely weapon—a slingshot. A man from town and saw the boy heading towards the woods with his sling-

shot and asked if he would like to borrow his .22 rifle. The boy borrowed the rifle along and eight shells. When he returned the rifle, he had only four rabbits. Before the man could tease him about his aim, the boy handed him back four unused shells.

In 1936, his father deserted the family. When he was sixteen, his mother died. Because he was unable to care for his younger siblings, he was forced to put the three youngest into an orphanage. He would reclaim them later.

After the Japanese attack on Pearl Harbor, he tried to enlist, but he was rejected for being too young. He waited until his eighteenth birthday and tried to join the Marines, but was rejected again, this time because of his small size. Finally, the Army accepted him.



When approaching a German machine gun nest a soldier began waving a white flag, but not trusting the Germans' he urged his friend to stay down, but his friend started toward the position and was killed. This Brother charged the machine gun position and single-handedly wiped out the German machine gun crew. He then used the gun to destroy several other enemy positions. For this act, he received the Distinguished Service Cross. Soon after he would take part in actions that would earn him the Medal of Honor. He was credited with destroying six tanks, killing over 240 German soldiers and wounding and capturing many others, nearly single-handedly. He received thirty-three United States military medals, plus five medals from France and one from Belgium. He became the most highly decorated soldier of World War II.

He was invited to Hollywood where he made forty-four feature films. Even though he saw a great deal of success, an illness plagued him. He became addicted to sleeping pills. One of his great legacies was that he finally broke the taboo about publicly discussing war-related mental conditions. He spoke candidly about his own problems and urged the government to extend health care benefits to address PTSD.

Brother Audie Murphy was raised to Master Mason in North Hollywood Lodge No. 542 in North Hollywood, California in 1955.






