## Notes from the Senior Warden:

Did you know...



In continuation of last year's Senior Warden's messages, we will continue to highlight Masons from different professions and walks of life whom, have contributed greatly to our society.

This mason was born in Boulder, Colorado on October 19th, 1901. He never graduated from High School Due to the 1918 Influenza outbreak. He won an alternate appointment to attend the United States Naval Academy and after graduation he was commissioned as an Ensign in the USN. This mason, during World War II was placed in command of two destroyer divisions and two destroyer squadrons. To his squadrons he gave a standing order "Destroyers to attack on enemy contacts without orders from the task force commander." After the engagement, this mason asked an Ensign what the difference between a good officer and a poor officer was. He told him "The difference between a good officer and a poor one, is about 10 seconds." He was also known for pushing his destroyers to boiler bursting speed. When



one of his destroyers had engine problems, the squadron was forced to reduce speed to 31 knots. This caused him to adopt the nickname "31 Knot".

#### Who is this Month's Mason? Admiral Arleigh Burke

In 1955, Burke was appointed Chief of Naval Operations (CNO). At the same time he was promoted to Admiral from a Rear Admiral which means he skipped over Vice Admiral. Overall Burke's time as CNO was one of growth and progress. He served an unprecedented three terms as CNO. In 1985, Burke was honored by giving his namesake to a flight of Destroyers. The USS Arleigh Burke DDG 51, the first in a new Aegis equipped guided missile destroyer. Burke passed away on January 1st, 1996 at the age of 94.

Burke was a member of the Ancient Accepted Scottish Rite in the Southern Masonic Jurisdiction (SMJ) where he was coronated as 33° Mason. His portrait hangs in SMJ portrait gallery.


