Message from the East







February includes many important dates to remember such as: President Washington's Birthday, Presidents Day, Valentine's Day and Ash Wednesday among others. As a nation we owe much to our first President and can learn much through his examples which embody the Masonic principles.

One of the best-known Freemasons, a leader and patriot without equal, George Washington was a surveyor, farmer, reluctant leader of the Continental Army and first President of the United States. Throughout his life Washington was ambitious yet reluctant and humble. He achieved many successes through strength of character, determination, and persistence. He was quoted as saying "Masonry is founded in justice and benevolence." And he believed "the grand

object of Masonry is to promote the happiness of the human race."

As we consider our first President let's also consider the four Cardinal Virtues of Temperance, Fortitude, Prudence and Justice. Temperance is the use of restraint by controlling desires, whereas fortitude is the strength to withstand pressure and maintain secrecy. Prudence is wisdom and Justice is adherence to law, as well as personal judgement in our actions. These virtues and others were embraced and applied by Brother Washington throughout his life and are valuable lessons to each of us.

A final note on Washington is that the tradition of reciting the Pledge of Allegiance in the Lodge has been attributed to him.



Did you know...

This month we have a duo of masons, both with occupations in the NBA. The first mason was born right here in Newark, New Jersey. In high school he played for Robert G. Cole High School in San Antonio. This mason's stepfather was a career Army Reservist, and the

family would travel with him on assignments. On a trip to Germany, this mason met his future coach at Louisiana State University. At LSU he was a two-time All-American, two-time SEC player of the year and the recipient of the Adolph Rupp Trophy as NCAA men's basketball player of the year. His career began as the #1 pick of the Orlando Magic in the 1992 NBA draft. In 1996 as a free agent, he went to the Los Angeles Lakers where he won 3 NBA championships. His nickname is "Diesel".

Who is this Month's Mason? Shaquille Rashaun O'Neal "Shaq" In a 2012 interview, Shaquille O'Neal was being questioned about a ring he was wearing while hosting Game Time. O'Neal responded "This is a ring of my profession. Shaq was made a mason in



2011 at Widow's Son Lodge No. 28 PHA in Boston, Massachusetts. Off the court Shaq has made public service a priority in his life, making untold donations to charities and organizations across the country, and even working as a reserve police officer in Los Angeles, Miami, and Phoenix.

This second mason was born September 25,1965 in Hamburg, Arkansas and is a former Basketball player. He played for 17 years in the NBA. His most notable time was with the Chicago Bulls, where he won 6 NBA championships. He was also a member of the "Dream Team" the 1992 Olympic basketball team. He is considered one of the greatest small forwards of all time. This mason is the only NBA player to have won an NBA title and Olympic gold medal in the same year twice, having done so in both 1992 and 1996. Who is this Month's Mason? Scottie Maurice Pippen

While Brother Pippen has said little about his Masonic career, he is a Prince Hall Mason from Unity Lodge No.454 PHA in Arkansas. People also speculate that this is the reason he wore number 33 during his career. However, he wore this number in college before ever becoming a mason.


