Dave Thomas was a member of Sol. D. Bayless Lodge #359. He was initiated at the age of 27 on April 13, 1959, passed on April 20, 1959 and raised on May 25, 1959 at <u>The Masonic</u> <u>Temple</u> in Fort Wayne, Indiana. Thomas was also a 33° Scottish Rite Mason and Shriner.

Brother Dave Thomas dedicated his life to giving funds and training resources to adoption agencies across the U.S. He created the Dave Thomas Foundation for Adoption focused solely on increasing the number of children getting adopted in the U.S. He created a legacy filled with a passion for helping others, quality to his customers, and love of Freemasonry. Dave along with a group of investors in 1982 founded The Wellington School in Ohio and to this day, it continues to operate. It was the first co-ed independent school in the Columbus Ohio area. Later in life (approximately 45 years) after dropping out of school, Dave officially received his GED.




Brethren,



## MEDFORD LODGE #178

Mason of the Month (March 2024)





#### Brother Michael Angermeier

#### Where were you born?

I was born in Philadelphia, but moved to Indian Mills when I was four. I have been a die-hard South Jersey guy ever since.

#### What was your current / last occupation?

I am an Assistant County Prosecutor with the Burlington County Prosecutors Office. Currently, I am the head of the Gangs, Guns, and Narcotics Task Force where we focus on gang violence, narcotics trafficking and fatal overdoses.

#### If you could meet any person (dead or alive), who would it be? George Washington.

I am sure this seems like kind of a bland answer, but I have always been fascinated by our First President. He was a paragon of virtue, duty, and honor and a man of great physical, mental, and moral strength. He was a man out of time even in his own age, with a code of conduct and morals more akin to a medieval knight than an enlightenment thinker. I still treasure my copy of his Rules of Civility.

He was also a true renaissance man. Washington was a great statesman, leader, warrior, politician, and Mason. It is no accident he was drawn to Masonry. He was part of a small group of heroic men who created and defended the greatest nation in history. Despite being offered almost limitless power, he turned it down to resume life as a planter because he believed that was best for the new Nation.

I would like the opportunity to see what this larger-than-life and almost mythical figure was like in person. I am sure he would not disappoint.

#### What is your favorite quote?

I have two:

"Never let the future disturb you. You will meet it, if you have to, with the same weapons of reason which today arm you against the present."

#### Marcus Aurelius

"It's not who I am underneath, but what I do that defines me." - Batman

#### Are there any random facts you can share about yourself with the brethren?

Looking back, becoming a Brother at the Medford Lodge seems like a matter of destiny. As soon as I moved back to Medford, I found myself repeatedly drawn to the Lodge.

In 2016, I moved to Medford and bought a house on Bank Street, only a few minutes' walk from our Lodge.

While working in the Major Crimes Unit, I was assigned to prosecute the murderer of Past Master Thomas W. Wright, II. When I responded to his residence the day of his murder, I accompanied officers who inventoried and processed the scene of the murder and the contents of his residence. I saw how Past Master Wright's Masonic regalia occupied a place of pride in his home.

During the initial investigation and subsequent prosecution, I spent a great deal of time with his family and learned that Masonry served as a guiding light for Past Master Wright and was a major reason he was able to turn his life around and become a success.

Also around this time I learned that First Assistant Prosecutor (Ret.) Philip Aronow, my mentor and friend, was a committed Mason. When I asked him about it, he introduced me to the values and joy of Masonry, encouraged me to join, and assisted in my pursuit of Light.

#### What keeps you engaged and active with the lodge?

Masonry provides men with something vital that is increasingly rare today. In a world of constantly changing subjective "truths" and moral relativism, Masonry is a bastion of truth and decency. The core values of moral and intellectual strength, appreciation of beauty, wisdom, pursuit of Light and knowledge, humility, fairness, generosity, and brotherly love have remained unchanged for hundreds of years. The men who form our Lodge do not merely share these values; they celebrate them.

The feeling of community and brotherhood is also very important to me. Unfortunately, my work keeps me from attending regular communications and degrees as much as I would like, but every time I am able to attend, I feel welcomed by the Brothers and at home in our Lodge.

Also, as a student of history, I love that the rituals and values of Masonry remained unchanged from the days of the Founding Fathers. I think this unbroken connection to the past is so important.
