Greetings Brethren,

The first sound that you hear within the Lodge is the sound of the Gavel. The judge calls a court to order while other organizations use the Gavel to open and close meetings. But, we as Free and Accepted Masons have embedded it into our ritual as well. The common gavel is one of the three main tools in Masonry, along with the square and compasses. While the square represents virtue and morality and the compasses represent the individual's ability to control and direct their passions, the gavel represents the power of self-reflection and self-improvement.

The Worshipful Master controls the meeting, but each Mason must use the Common Gavel to continuously improve themselves in Masonry to remove the large stones and small pieces.

Through the symbology of the Gavel we clear our minds of the vices of life and square ourselves for that “house not made with hands”. The Gavel is the first working tool we are introduced to and the last sound we hear at each meeting. As we continue on our travels we must ensure that we continue to shape ourselves throughout our journey.

The next time you hear the Gavel in the East will it be a call to order or, will it be a reminder to continue to shape yourself piece by piece.

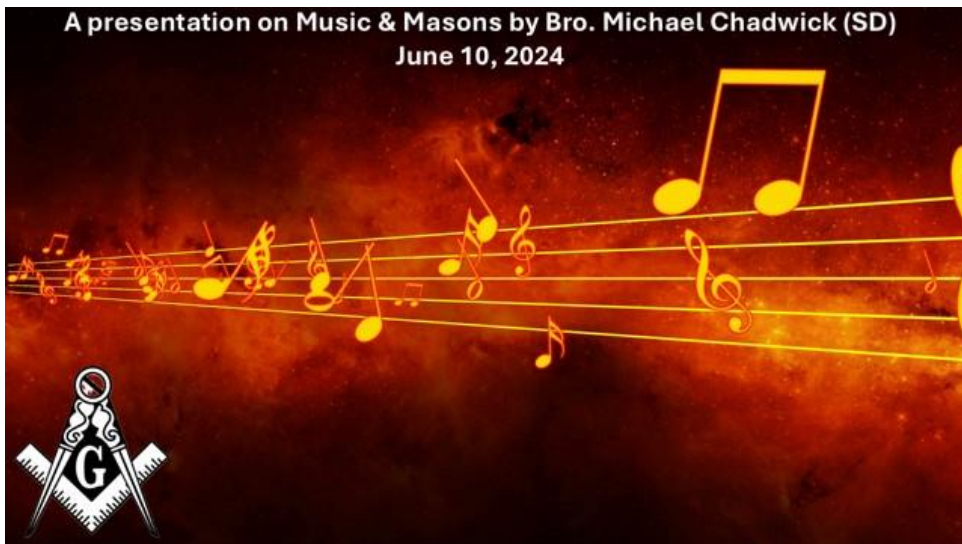

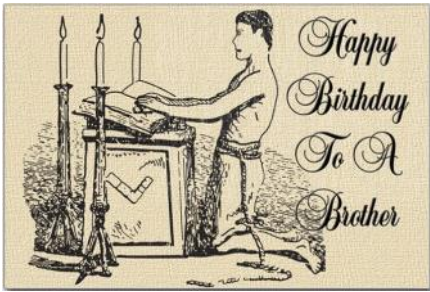

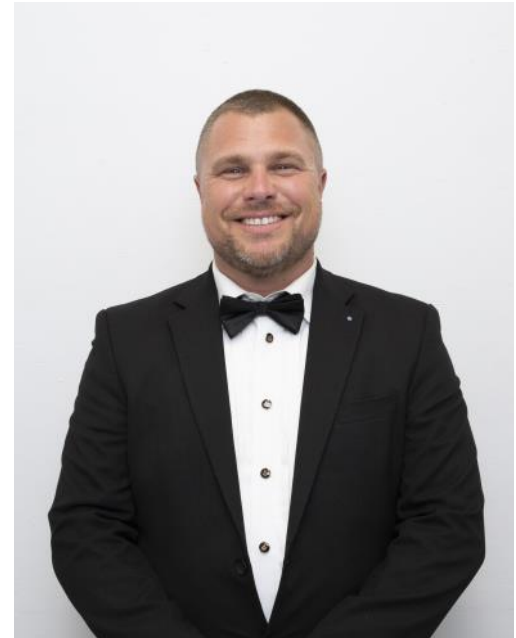
Notes from the Senior Warden.

Did you know...



This Month's Mason was born in Culver City, California, July 24, 1949, in a Catholic home. His father passed in a car crash when he was two and his mother never remarried. He became interested in performing after taking a theatrical class in seventh grade, however never acted on his interest.

This mason graduated from Thousand Oaks High School. In 1968, he appeared as a contestant on *The Dating Game*. Later he was drafted into the United States Army in 1970. He trained as a medic and was stationed in West Germany where he was a member of a theatrical group called The Training Road Show.



After being honorably discharged, he used the benefits of the G.I. Bill to enroll in the California Institute of the Arts and received a BA degree in drama from The Evergreen State College in 1975. This mason has an extensive career in the TV and film industries. He began his career as a stand-up comedian, first entering the national spotlight when he was featured on Billy Crystal's first cable TV special and went on to become a series regular on ABC's *Fridays*. He is best known for playing Cosmo Kramer on the television sitcom *Seinfeld* from 1989 to 1998. Recently, he had a small role on *Curb your Enthusiasm*.

Who is this Month's Mason? Brother Michael Anthony Richards

Micheal Richards was initiated on December 17, 1998, in Riviera Lodge No. 780 in Pacific Palisades, California. Later was passed on March 25, 1999, and raised a Master Mason on May 20, 1999. He affiliated with Culver City-Foshay Lodge No. 467 in Culver City, California, in 1999 and gave his Third-Degree proficiency later that year. Richards is also a member of the Ancient Accepted Scottish Rite, Southern Masonic Jurisdiction where he has received the Knights Commander of the Court of Honor award.

Our lives changed forever on November 28, 2023, when our beloved Rachael ('Rae') Storer was sent for a CT-scan following severe headaches. She was ultimately diagnosed with an Astrocytoma, a Grade 3 brain cancer.

She had brain surgery to remove the 6mm tumor, followed by six weeks of radiation, and is now facing 11-months of chemotherapy. She had to undergo fertility treatments to freeze her eggs as the chemo may make her infertile.

Our family has gotten involved with the National Brain Tumor Society (NBTS) with the hopes that a cure will be found to not only benefit Rae, but all individuals facing a terrifying brain cancer diagnosis.

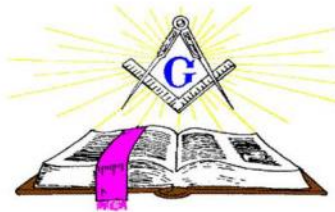
