# Message from the East



Greetings Brethren,



During every Communication we say the words, "So Mote it Be". To the experienced Mason it is second nature but, for the newly initiated it is an unfamiliar term. Why is this term used and what is its history?

So Mote it Be (SMIB) is found in writings by Chaucer and is contained in the Regius Poem, the oldest document of our Craft. The phrase indicates assent or agreement and a trust in the Deity. It is the Masonic form of AMEN. A further explanation is it's relationship with prayer to your personal Deity with faith and

trust.

As we enter the Lodge our first time, a prayer is said that concludes with "So Mote it Be". Regardless of our individual faith, with these simple words we are in agreement as one body as we place our trust in the Deity. It serves as a timeless reminder of the power of intention. It is a powerful phrase that expresses the idea that a spoken intention or wish will come true.

When we use the phrase "So Mote it Be," we are strengthening our connection to the Deity and agree that whatever happens is part of a greater plan. The phrase has stood the test of time, and its meaning and significance continue to resonate with Masons today. So Mote it Be.




# Notes from the Senior Warden.

Did you know...



This Freemason is an American comedian, actor, director, satirist and writer. He was born in Peoria, Illinois on December 1, 1940. From the age of 10 he was raised by his maternal grandmother in

the brothel that she ran, after his mother had abandoned him. A class clown in school and a community theater actor in his teens, He became a successful stand-up comedian, television writer and movie actor, starring in 40 films between 1967 and 1991. His movies included "Some Kind of Hero, The Toy, Superman III, Jo Jo Dancer, Your Life Is Calling, Blazing Saddles, Silver Streak, Greased Lightning, Critical Condition, See No Evil, Hear No Evil, Harlem Nights and Greased Lightning". He spent a short time in the U.S. Military from 1958 to 1960. Upon his return home, He



married Patricia Price in 1960 and went on to have a total of 4 marriages during his life. After ending his 1st marriage, He pursued a career as an entertainer. He found work as a stand-up comic throughout the Midwest, playing African American clubs in such cities as East St. Louis and Pittsburgh. In 1963 he moved to New York and began appearing regularly in night clubs with artists such as Bob Dylan and performers such as Woody Allen. At the time he was inspired by Bill Cosby and his comedy was more middlebrow in comparison to the material that he would use later in his career. In 1986 He was diagnosed with multiple sclerosis. In 2005 He would pass away from a heart attack in Los Angles. He is listed as number 1 on Comedy Central's list of greatest stand-up comedians. Lastly, he was the first recipient of the prestigious annual Mark Twain Humor Prize in 1998.

#### WB Brother F. Lawrence Vernamonti

#### Where were you born?

I was born in Camden, NJ when it was a vibrant city with theaters, and shopping. Before I was a year old my father was transferred from RCA Camden to RCA Moorestown, and we moved to a small cape cod on Harris Ave which was just a block away from the big fire that cleared the way for development up to the Friends School in. It was a great time as the town was very diverse and everyone knew everyone.

#### What was your current / last occupation?

I have been blessed with a great career. After opening my private practice, I was made Medical director of the NJ Diagnostic and Surgical Eye Center in Kennedy Hospital, Cherry Hill.
