Message from the East





Greetings Brethren,

Saint John the Evangelist is celebrated each December by Freemasons. Together with Saint John the Baptist (The Holy St. John's) they represent a balance between zeal, passion and learning. He was one of the original twelve apostles and is thought to be the only one to have not been killed for his faith.

The Feast of Saint John the Evangelist occurs on December 27th which is aligned with the Winter solstice. Freemasons celebrate this feast day, dating back to the 18th century when the Feast Day was used for the installation of Grand Masters. Many Grand Lodge jurisdictions require their subordinate lodges to install their officers on or prior to St. John the

Evangelist's Day.

The Evangelist was known for his values of Brotherly Love, Charity, Truth, Faith, and Enduring Integrity. These values are considered as the main reasons for the esteem paid to him by the Craft. Tradition informs us that Masonic Lodges were originally dedicated to King Solomon. In the sixteenth century Saint John the Baptist was considered to be the patron of Freemasonry. Subsequently this honor was divided between the two Saints John. In the United States, Lodges are universally erected to God, and dedicated to the Holy Saints John. The alignment of the Saints John to the solstices is representative of moving from darkness to the light.

As we move into the Winter solstice we too should take time to reflect on the year and begin moving toward more light.



Notes From The Senior Warden



Kotes from the Senior Warden: Did you know...



This month's mason is remembered as one of America's most influential pianists, actor and band leaders of the swing era. Born in Montgomery, Alabama on March 17, 1919. When he was four years

old his family moved to Chicago, Illinois where his father became a Baptist minister. His mother, who was the church organist, began teaching him how to play the organ. He began his musical career at age 12 as the church organist. After graduating from the church ensemble to the Royal Dukes, his first jazz group moved to the west coast and performed in clubs around Los Angeles. In the city of angels, he formed a group specializing in light and joyful swing music. His career skyrocketed when he doubled as a singer for the trio and began recording hits like "Sweet Loraine" and



"Unforgettable." His career spanned almost three decades where he found success and recorded over 100 songs that became hits on the pop charts. Over the course of his life, he accrued 7 Grammy nominations and won record of the year in 1962. Despite achieving mainstream success, during his career he faced intense racial discrimination. He was not a major vocal public figure in the civil rights movement, he was a member of his local NAACP branch and participated in the 1963 March on Washington. He regularly performed for civil rights organizations. He also consulted with John F. Kennedy and later, Lyndon B. Johnson on matters of Civil Rights.

Who is this Month's Mason? Brother Nathaniel Adams Coles "Nat King Cole"

Brother Cole joined the Masonic fraternity in 1944 when he petitioned Thomas Waller Lodge No. 49, Prince Hall Affiliation, in California with a few of his bandmates. Cole later became a Scottish Rite Freemason.


