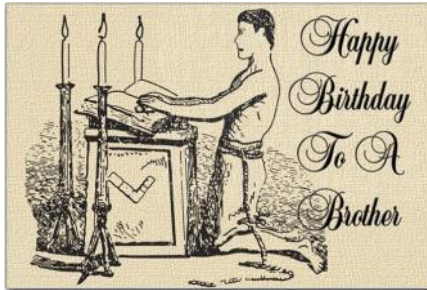

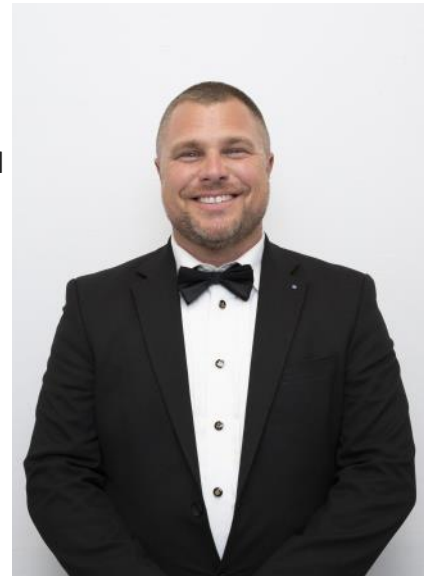

Notes From The Senior Warden

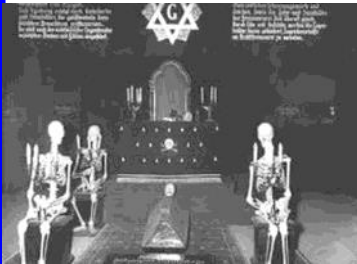


Brethren

I enjoy history and interesting anecdotes. During my year in the West, I will be sharing thoughts on just some of these fascinating moments and aspects of Masonic history. I hope you will find them as interesting as I do.

The Forget-Me-Not Pin

During World War II, Nazi Germany placed many restrictions against any institution it saw as hostile to, or inconsistent with, its ideals. Adolf Hitler believed that the Freemasons were a tool of the Jews. His March 23, 1933 “Gesetz zur Behebung der Not von Volk und Reich” (Law to Remedy the Distress of People and Reich) gave him power to pass laws without the consent of the Reichstag or the President of the Reich. Also known as The Enabling Act of 1933, the law passed due in small part to the Nazi Party using intimidation and persecution to prevent all of the Communists and a quarter of the Social Democrats from taking their seats, detaining all of them in “protective detention” camps.



One outcome of The Enabling Act of 1933 was the immediate dissolution of all Masonic lodges in the Third Reich, and also dictated no soldier or member of the Nazi party could be a Freemason. Many Freemasons were sent to concentration camps and forced to wear an inverted red triangle badge. Anti-Masonic propaganda was spread to foster distrust of the craft, including mock lodge displays as seen in the photo here.



In order to secretly mark their identity for their fellow brethren, The Grand Lodge of the Sun started wearing blue forget-me-not pins instead of the square and compasses. This was a way to encourage each other to stay strong even in the darkest of times. When the Grand Lodge of the Sun re-opened in 1947, they continued to wear the forget-me-not pin as an emblem honoring those who resisted the Nazi regime during the war.

It is difficult to know for certain how many Freemasons were murdered in Europe during the war. It is estimated that tens of thousands of our brethren were slaughtered by the Third Reich. Fascism in general is not friendly to Freemasons. In Fascist Spain under Franco, it was a crime to be a Freemason, punishable by prison terms equal to the number of degrees possessed. Master Masons served three years in Spanish prisons merely for being Freemasons. Mussolini also declared Masonic lodges illegal. He had the Grand Master arrested (he died in prison), and removed the Masonic emblems at the base of Garibaldi’s monument in Rome.

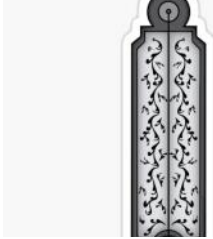


Notes From The Senior Warden

Notes from the Junior Warden.

Brethren,

Greetings from the South! Thank you for electing me as the Junior Warden, I am honored and look forward to serving you and the Lodge this year. I hope to bring you articles of interest. I start out by posing a question to you: Have you ever wondered how serious your Brothers take to heart our Masonic oaths and obligations? I often have, as all of our degrees speak of aiding our Brothers in need. This sacred bond we have to each other is meant to transcend all boundaries. It is a Brotherhood.



As there is a code of honor serving in the military, there is a code of honor being a Mason, what happens when a Mason goes to war? In this column I would like to share a few accounts of Masonic Brotherhood in times of war that I have come across.

"A Savannah Story"

Found in the records of a lodge in Savannah is a story of how, with war raging, Confederate soldiers helped a Union Brother complete a Masonic degree. According to an article from the Georgia Masonic Messenger, shortly after the start of the war, Union soldiers captured the beaches on Hilton Head. Before long, the northerners sent a message under the white flag: A Union soldier had passed through the Fellowcraft Degree before shipping out, and they wanted to see if a nearby lodge could test and raise him to a Master Mason.

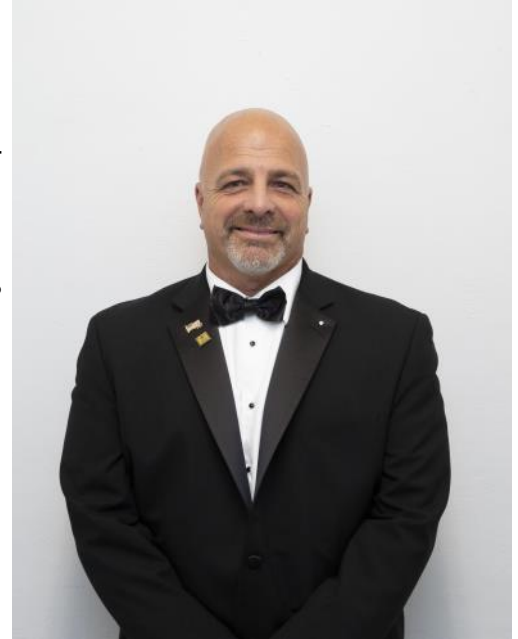
Within days, a detail of Confederate cavalry escorted the Fellowcraft Mason and several Master Masons of the north safely through the Confederate Lines and over 30 miles of Confederate defenses to Savannah and the local Masonic lodge. The records note that this Brother was proficient in the Fellowcraft Degree, and he was raised to the Degree of a Master Mason. After the ritual was complete, the Confederate cavalry returned their Brothers to Hilton Head without incident.

To me this is an incredible demonstration of Brotherhood, to pause from war to help a Brother Mason get his degree! There are many more stories from the Civil War I plan to share throughout the year.¹
