

# **Message from the East**



### Greetings Brethren,



In masonry we hear during the EA lecture that there are three ornaments of the lodge: the Mosaic Pavement, Indented Tessel, and the Blazing Star. A few years back when RW Arthur Pelzer spoke at a DLI about The Blazing Star, I walked away from this encounter with more questions. What does the Blazing star symbolize? What is its importance? Where is the Blazing star located in each lodge? We are told in the EA lecture that the Blazing star represents Divine Providence, that it is located at the center of the Lodge, and nothing more is ever spoken.

While researching the meaning and origins of the Blazing Star, I found countless sources from over the years, all of which have

varying interpretations of what this symbol represents and where it originated. Some believe it represents the star which guided the wise men to Bethlehem. Others believe it represents the shining rays of light when the Almighty delivered the two tablets of stone containing the 10 commandments to Moses on Mount Sinai. An-



cient astronomers suggested the blazing star was a grouping of rare astronomical phenomena. Some believe it refers to the sun, which brightens the earth daily with its rays, dispensing its blessings to mankind,

and giving light and life to all things.

This leads me to question of where the Blazing Star is visibly represented in each lodge today. Most researchers can agree, it's supposed to be placed in the center of the lodge. *The Short Talk Bulletin* article entitled "Blazing Star" mentions that after the introduction of Anderson's Constitution in 1723, which introduced many new symbols into ritual, the Blazing Star was drawn on lodge floors as the prominent feature of the lodge. Later it was painted on large pieces of canvas that could be rolled and stored away. Finally, with the addition of tracing boards it was placed thereon for instructing new candidates. Thus, through the passage of time, carelessness, and the omission of certain lecture pieces, it has almost led to the omission of its significance.

With so many varying answers, opposing viewpoints, and religious undertones, I feel the Blazing Star is left to everyone's own interpretation. I would like to offer it to my brethren as a way point or a guide that serves as a moral compass which directs you in all your actions throughout life. It reminds us that if we make decisions and direct our actions along this rule and guide, then we may finally complete our spiritual journey.





### **Notes From The Senior Warden**



Notes from the Senior Warden:



#### Brethren

New Jersey was one of the first states with active Freemasonry. The Grand Lodge of NJ was formally established in 1787. One of the early Freemasons here was John Skene, who was a member of Scotland's Aberdeen Lodge #1. Skene

was the first Freemason whose name can be traced to the new world.

Skene moved to the province of West Jersey (pictured here) in 1682, where he purchased three hundred acres that he named Peachfield. This would later become Northampton Township in 1688, and ultimately, Westampton Township in 1850.

In 1730, the Grand Master of England appointed Daniel Coxe, Jr. of West Jersey as Provincial Grand Master of Freemasons for the provinces of New York, New Jersey, and Pennsylvania. Just a year later, Benjamin Franklin would be made a Mason on February 1, 1731 at St. John's Lodge.

Prior to 1723, lodges did not keep written records until The Grand Lodge at London began doing so. Franklin and his Brethren who met in Philadelphia began keeping official records in an account book known as *Libre B* beginning in June of 1731.

The Beteilhe Manuscript, authored by Francis Beteilhe, is one of the earliest official Masonic records. It is bound along with an original of the Book of Constitutions as printed by Franklin in 1734, and is now in the archives of the Grand Lodge of Massachusetts.

Brethren,



Greetings from the South! As I continue to read about acts of Brotherhood during war, a theme has been presented: These acts are not Grand Lodge directed, but are self-inspired by individual Masons upholding our principles of Masonic Brotherhood on the battlefield I find

these acts truly inspiring and to me it means that these Brothers have taken to heart our Masonic oaths and obligations and have put them into action instead of just words. Here is another example of Masonic kindness that occurred at the Battle of Gettysburg (1-3 July 1863):



"A private, Anson C. Miller, of Company J, 151<sup>st</sup> Pennsylvania, was shot four times near the Lutheran Seminary. Left behind by his retreating comrades, he was set upon by a group of rebel troops who stole his clothing, blankets, and food until he made a Masonic appeal: "He used those words which a Master Mason hears and heeds, even amid the fury and of battle. Immediately there stepped out from among the Rebel soldiers one who remembers his duty to a needed brother. He was a Tennessean – Menturn by name. He declared that he had never robbed a wounded foe, and that he would not permit it to be done by others."

"Incredibly, Anson's property was restored, he was evacuated and despite dim prospects, he survived the battle."<sup>1</sup>

Do the words in the last sentence of the second paragraph sound familiar?
